Our Red Ribbons have now closed for the year. Final presentation of ribbons will be held in Week 9 during walkthrough awards.










































Braddy Promoting Success Target Week 9

This week at school we are explicitly teaching the BPS behaviour expectation of "We Respect our Environment". You can follow up this message at home by:

- Discussing that respecting your environment means you actively look after the equipment, belongings and surrounding of the school for the benefit of everyone.
- Acknowledging when your child puts rubbish into the bin or recycles materials, they are showing respect for the environment.
- Using a proactive consequence in a negative situation. At school this might be a student pumping up the basketballs for everyone because they were kicking it and making it flat. Think about how you might use this strategy at home to help teach your child how to respect their environment.
